
Mrs. Wohlfeil's Kindergarten Class



We started our measurement unit this week in Kindergarten! The kids practiced measuring things with non-standard units. We used our "feet" and unifix cubes to measure things around our classroom!












Mrs. Hughes' First Grade Class

Congratulations to Abby & Mackenzie for receiving a class "Kindness Award" for always being helpful and kind!






Second Grade Class


