



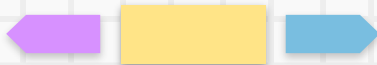
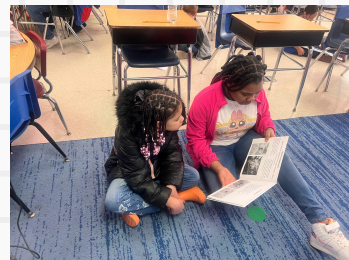
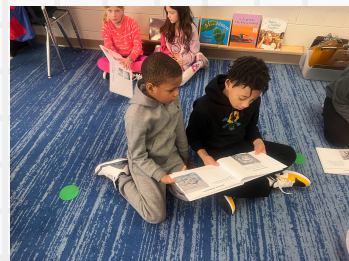
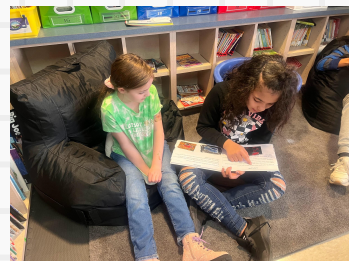
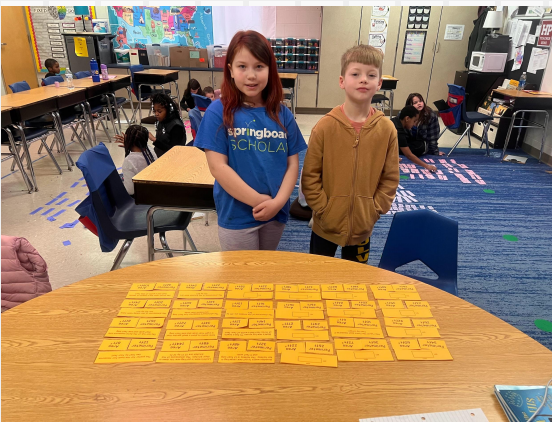
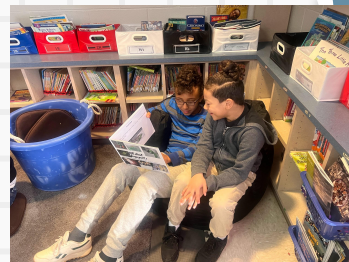
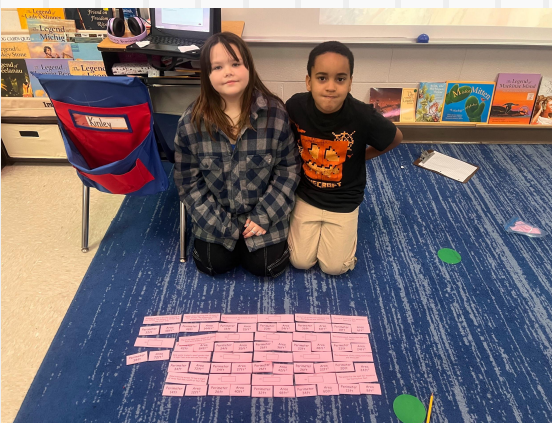
We had a very busy week...

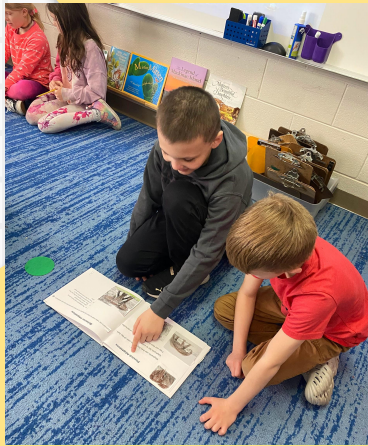
We started our week of with a special guest, Stephanie Chang (Michigan State Senator), who came in to read aloud to our class.

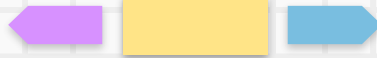
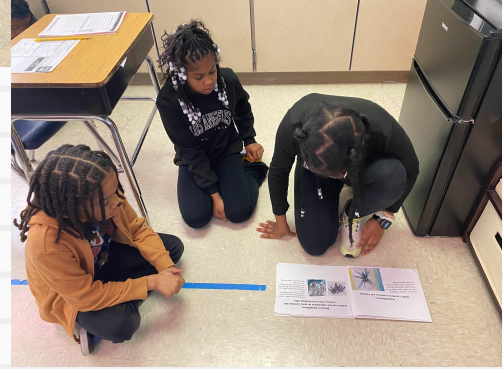
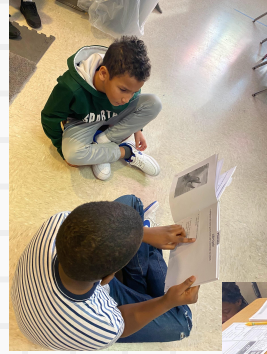
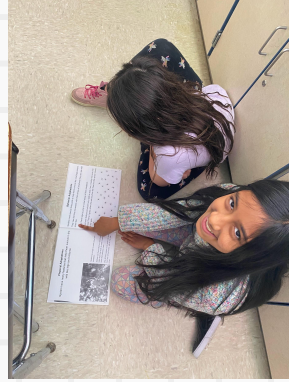
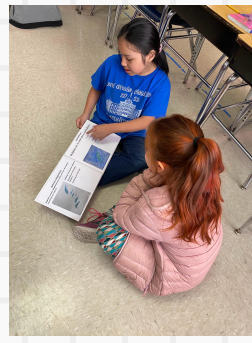
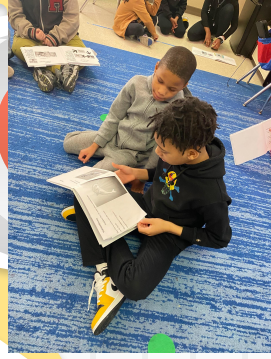






Mrs. Houston's Fourth Grade Class

insightful!






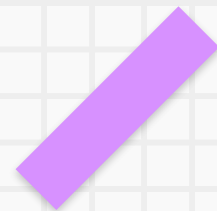

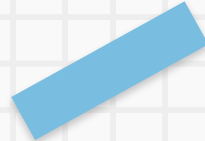
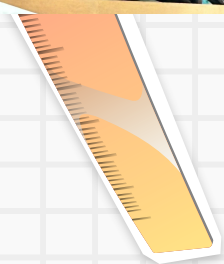
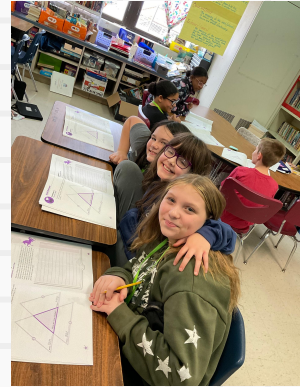
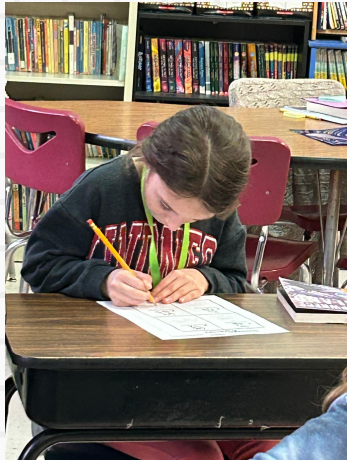
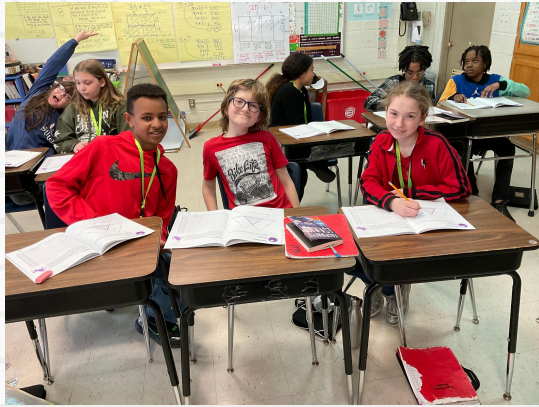


Mrs. Bienstock's Fifth Grade Class
