


# Mrs. Gorski's Kindergarten Class










This week we worked on new skills during our centers time.


We added a new center to help us notice and match digraphs at the beginnings of words.

We also added new topics at our writing center.






# Ms. Mara's Kindergarten Class


# Mrs. Becker's First Grade Class





Our class got to experience an awesome performance by them as well as learn about different woodwind, brass, and string instruments!





# Mrs. Beller's Second Grade Classroom

This week in math we have been busy learning about the different types of graphs. Students had fun counting how many pockets they had and using that data to make a line plot.









# Mrs. Yager's Second Grade Classroom
