MSTEP Assessment Season Begins This Week

The MSTEP test is an important assessment designed to measure your child's proficiency in various subjects, providing valuable insights into their academic progress. While standardized testing can sometimes feel daunting, we want to reassure you that it is nothing for our students to stress about. The purpose of the MSTEP is to evaluate their learning journey thus far and identify areas of strength as well as areas where additional support may be needed.

On these days, testing will be conducted in the morning before lunch. Students need to arrive at school on time and well-rested. To support your child's success, we encourage you to take the following steps at home:

- 1. Bedtime: Making sure your child gets a good night's sleep is super important! It helps their brain work at its best. Try to keep a consistent bedtime routine so they can feel refreshed and ready to tackle the day. This means taking away devices and setting a firm boundary.
- 2. Breakfast: Think of breakfast as fuel for your child's brain! This means either getting them to school early to allow them time to eat the school-provided breakfast or enjoying a meal with the students to ensure they are ready for the day.
- 3. Be on time: Being punctual is like being a superhero! Getting to school on time gives your child a chance to settle in, say hi to friends, and get ready for the day's adventures. So, let's do our best to be prompt, especially on testing days

Hazel Park Summer School

Hazel Park School District will be offering extended learning experiences in the areas of math and literacy throughout the summer months. Additional information will be communicated to parents by the end of April. Students must attend the morning portion to be eligible for the afternoon activities.

New State Car Seat Regulations

Parents, mark your calendars. April 2 is when Michigan's new car seat laws go into effect. If you break the law, you could get a ticket, but more importantly, these laws could save lives.

One big change is that children under the age of two must be in a rear-facing seat.

Once they turn 5, they can move to a booster seat using a lap and shoulder belt until they are 8, or until they reach 4-foot-9.

All children 13 and under must ride in the backseat of the car, if there is an open backseat. There are some exceptions to these rules, including reaching the maximum weight or height allowed by the car seat's manufacturer.

Students Picked Up After 3:30

Late Pick-Up Procedures (Elementary Buildings) As a reminder, dismissal times for our elementary buildings are 3:10 pm or 11:20 am on half days unless your child regularly attends latchkey. While life's complex circumstances may occasionally get in the way of a timely pick-up, you must contact your school office and let them know you are running late. Any student who is not picked up by 3:30 pm will be waiting in the front office, which closes @ 4:00.

The first late pick-up there will be no fee. However after the first late pick-up a \$10.00 fee will be charged for every 15 minutes after 3:30. If you have more than one child, the fee will be applied to each child.

If a student is not picked up by 4:30 the Hazel Park Police will be contacted. If you are unable to pick up your child on time, it is imperative that you have an alternative plan for daily dismissal, as the office staff is not equipped to provide after school care.
