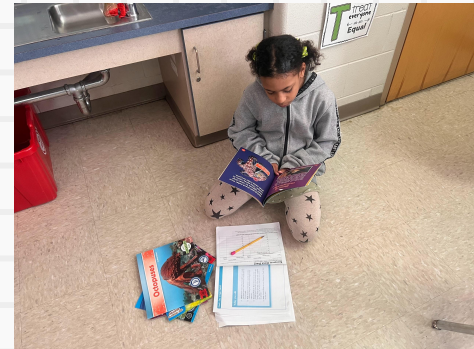
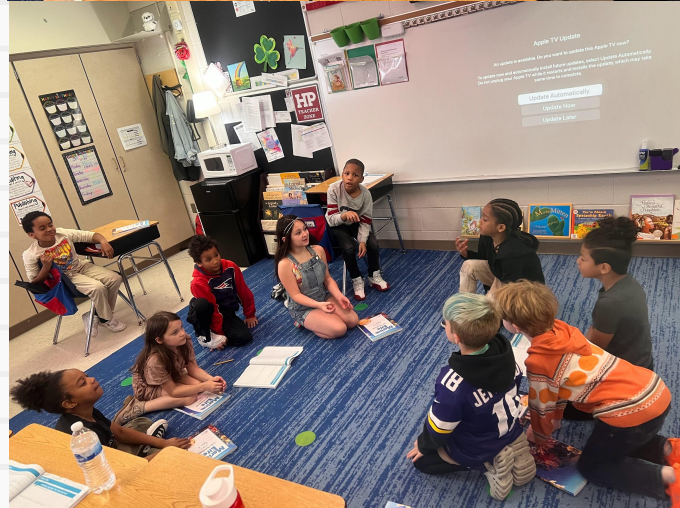
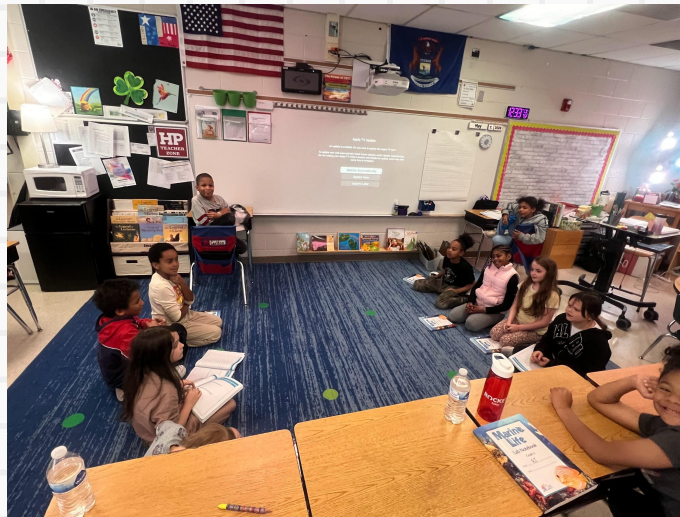
In ELA, we have started diving into our Marine Life unit. The students are learning how to evaluate resources, form opinions about specific animals, and debate their opinion respectfully.

In Social Studies, we are finishing our history unit. Students have learned a lot about Native American culture and traditions and how the pioneers got started here in Michigan.

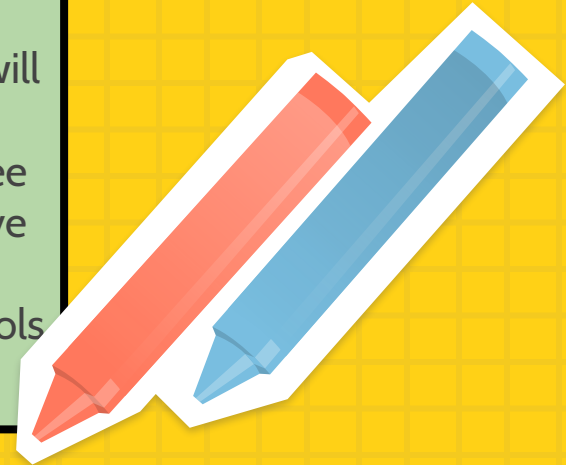


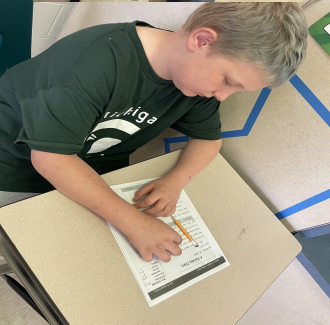
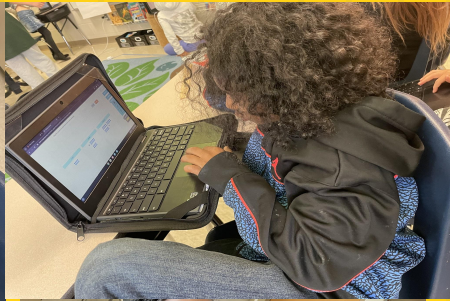
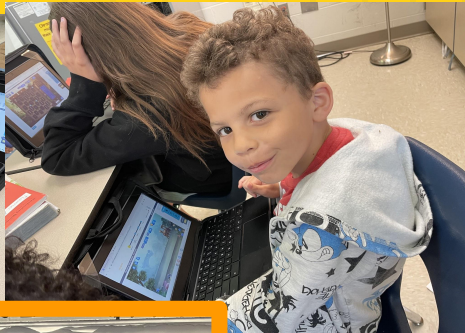
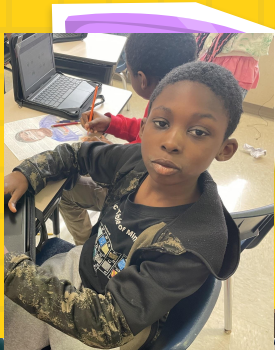

This week we got to celebrate our wonderful mothers. We painted beautiful scenic canvases to show our moms how much we appreciate them. Thanks for all you do. We love you!



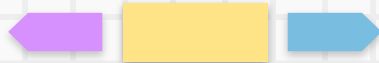



Bonding, and creating these last few weeks fun and educational is the goal. Our morning meeting have been exciting in that fact to help us all connect and communicate.







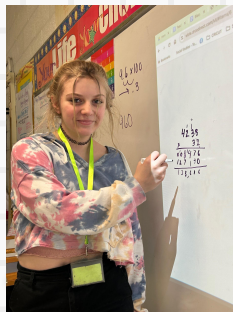
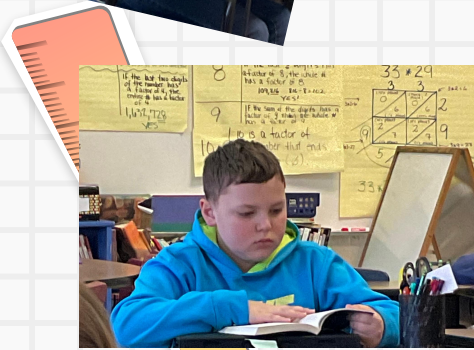
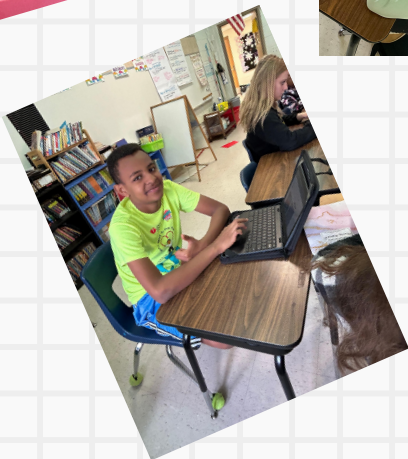
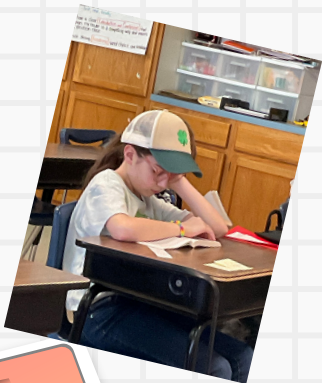
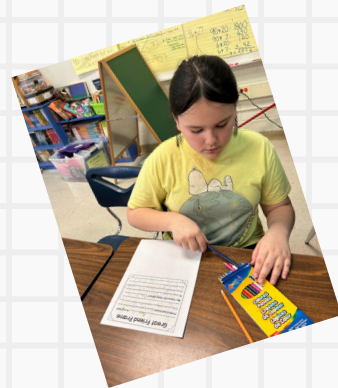
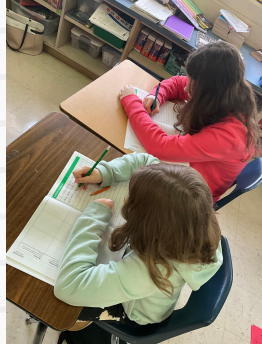
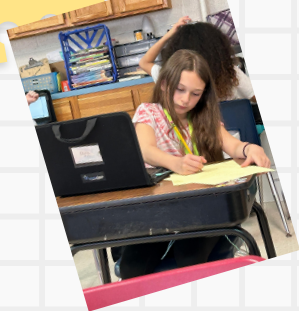
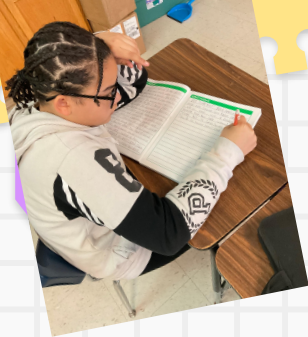
