



### Not Just a Shiny Trinket

Imagine you are at your favorite restaurant with a friend, catching up on all the latest. Suddenly, your friend stops talking and looks intently past your shoulder. Curious, you turn to see what has caught your friend's attention.

At the counter behind you, a young man is leaning over, red-faced and holding his arms across his stomach. He begins coughing, but it does not sound like a normal cough - it is high-pitched and wheezy. He reaches toward the jacket hanging over the back of his chair, but stops abruptly. You notice his arm shaking, then suddenly his body goes limp and he tumbles to the floor.

You look with shock at your friend, and both of you immediately get up and go to the man's side. His face appears pale and swollen. He is unconscious, breathing shallow, labored breaths. Your friend shakes the man's shoulder and calls loudly to him, with no response.

By this time, other diners have gathered around and someone yells to call an ambulance. As your friend picks up the phone and dials 911, you catch sight of something shiny on the young man's wrist. You turn his hand over and find a bracelet with the medical "staff and serpent" logo on it! On the other side is engraved:

Aaron Allergic to seafood and tree nuts Carries EpiPens ICE: (123) 456-7890 Of course! You grab the man's jacket and pull EpiPens from the pocket. With the phone now on speaker, you relay Aaron's information, and the emergency operator walks you through giving Aaron a dose of epinephrine.

By the time the paramedics arrive, Aaron is breathing more freely and just beginning to wake.

If you *hadn't* found the information on Aaron's medical ID, how differently could this scenario have turned out?

Allergies, cardiac conditions, epilepsy, autism, diabetes, and bleeding disorders are just a handful of MANY medical conditions which require specific assessment and timely treatment in an emergency. A clear, accurately written medical ID - whether it is a bracelet, necklace, shoe tag, or the like - is much more than a fashionable accessory; it can speak for you if you are unable to speak for yourself!

If you have any chronic conditions or require special considerations for such, ask your healthcare provider how best to list them on an ID. For more information, check out::

#### The food goes very quickly, so please come early to get in line.

Hazel Park Schools has partnered with Gleaners Community Food Bank to bring the School Mobile Food Pantry to our students and their families. *Food distributions per family total 36 lbs of food which includes milk, lean meats, fresh fruits, vegetables, and dry goods every month.* 

Please line up in your car in the parking lot, going down Elza in front of the school. <u>Please do not block any</u> <u>driveways and be sure to line up along the curb to avoid blocking the road.</u> We appreciate your cooperation in this matter out of respect and safety for our neighbors.

Here are a few **NEW RULES** and procedures provided by Gleaners: 1. Food pickup line will **NOT** begin until 9:30 am; 2. Walk ups **CANNOT** receive food until 10 am (30 minutes after the line has begun); 3. Food will **ONLY** be distributed for 1 hour, our distribution will end at 10:30 am; 4. You must be present with your card, no pickups or delivery allowed; 5. No more than 6 servings per car; 6. Staff must come through the line in their vehicle or wait until all the cars have been processed; 7. We are now required to ask for your income and/or program you are enrolled in (ex. SNAP Benefits); 8. We **CANNOT** hold food for families, it must be obtained during the Gleaners distribution; 9. We will **NEVER** ask for a driver's license; 10. Any remaining food will be sent back to Gleaners.

Please have your Gleaners card ready when you arrive. If you are new to Gleaners and do not have a card, you will be asked to fill out a form with your information as well as information for those in your household.

Gleaner's information will be sent by email and voice messages as reminders when you sign up for communications through your children's school.

Sign up for communications may be done through your Parent Portal on PowerSchool or the school district website, <a href="www.hazelparkschools.org/parents/resources-quick-links">www.hazelparkschools.org/parents/resources-quick-links</a>, then click on Alert Sign up.

Contact your Community Representative to help your family with resources for things such as bill pay, eyeglasses, local food pantries, and other resources. We want to make sure that all the needs of our students are addressed to the best of our abilities.
