Dear Hazel Park Advantage parents and students,

- **Testing Dates Update:** On Wednesday, April 9, 2025, students in grades 8, 9, and 10 will take the PSAT and attend school for a half day. They will be released at 11:15am. Students in grade 11 and some 12th graders will take the SAT and be released at approximately 1pm. **Students in grades K-7 will not have school on April 9.**

On April 10, 2025, 11th grade students only will take the Workkeys test and will be dismissed prior to noon. **All other grades will not attend on April 10th.**

- **Half Day:** Friday, April 11, 2025 is a half day. All students will be released at 11:15am. Please plan accordingly.
- **Prom Tickets:** Prom is Friday, April 25, 2025 at Macray Harbor which is located at 30675 N. River Road, Harrison Township, MI 48045. Tickets are \$65 each, and the last day to purchase tickets is Monday, April 14, 2025. No exceptions will be made to this date, so please plan accordingly. Juniors and seniors are allowed to attend.

- **Backpacks:** Advantage students are not allowed to have backpacks in classes. Please remind your student to put his/her backpack in their locker. We do not provide locks for student lockers.
- **Cap and Gown Orders:** Parents of Seniors, please be certain that your future graduate orders their cap and gown asap. Please use this link to purchase your child's [Cap and Gown](#).

- **Illness Alert:** Whooping cough cases are on the rise, especially in southeast Michigan. Whooping Cough (Pertussis) is a respiratory illness that is easily spread by coughing and sneezing. The disease starts like the common cold, with runny nose or congestion, sneezing, and mild cough or fever. After 1-2 weeks, severe coughing begins. Pneumonia cases in the pediatric population are on the rise as well. Michigan normally experiences increases in pediatric patients presenting to emergency departments (ED) and urgent

care centers (UCC) with pneumonia in the late summer and early fall. There has been a notable 4-fold increase in patients 5-19 years of age presenting with pneumonia from August 1, 2024 to October 16, 2024 compared to the same time period in 2023.

Michigan is also seeing an increase in ED and UCC visits with a diagnosis of *Mycoplasma pneumoniae* (walking pneumonia). These infections are more common in summer and early fall and there are usually peaks of disease identified every 3 to 7 years. After a prolonged period of low incidence during the COVID-19 pandemic, there has been a global re-emergence of walking pneumonia. In 2024, CDC received reports of increased *M. pneumoniae* infections, including infections in young children. Common symptoms of walking pneumonia include pharyngitis, tracheobronchitis, and pneumonia with symptoms that include cough, fever, headache, malaise, and mild dyspnea.

Please be sure to schedule a visit with your doctor if your student is experiencing any of the above symptoms listed.

- **Cell Phone Policy:** In order to prioritize the importance of academics, our new cell phone policy is that students **must** place their phones in the cell phone locker, in each class, prior to the start of class. Students may retrieve their phones when their teacher indicates that the lesson, for that class, has ended. This means that a cell phone should not be visible during instructional time at all. If a student is caught with their phone during class, the phone will be confiscated and returned to the student at the end of the day.

Students will have the opportunity to use their phones during hall passing and lunch without penalty.

We ask that you support the school with this policy by calling the school office if you need to contact your student during the school day. We appreciate your support as we educate your scholar!

- **Online Classes:** All high school students at Advantage will have some classes that need to be completed online. Unfortunately, there is not enough time in the school day for students to complete all of the work necessary to finish their classes. In order for your student to experience success, please encourage your student to work on the online classes at home. The website is Subject.com. - **Breakfast/ Lunch:**

All students receive free meals at school each day. Breakfast is served from 7:30 - 8:00 a.m. at the school entrance. Lunch is provided in the cafeteria.

- **Chromebooks:**

Hazel Park is a 1:1 technology district. This means every HP student receives a technology device for use at school and at home provided the Chromebook agreement form is signed by a parent or guardian and the student. Chromebooks allow students access to online learning opportunities both in and out of the classroom. It is imperative that students bring their device and that it is fully charged each day.

- **Policy Reminders:** Personal Communication Devices (PCDs) include but are not limited to: **CELL PHONES**, computers, tablets, electronic readers, and/or other web-enabled devices of any type. Hazel Park Advantage staff reserves full discretion as to when students may use

PCDs. As a rule, when class begins, phones should be put in the cell phone locker provided in each class so learning is the primary focus.
