

Students may NOT bring personal laptops, Chromebooks or iPads for use at school. Every student MUST have a school-issued Chromebook with them each day.

Backpacks, purses, winter coats, hats and/or blankets may **NOT** be brought in classrooms. They must be placed in lockers. All students will be issued a school combination lock if they do not bring their own lock. A \$10 fine was issued but will be removed when the lock is replaced with a personal lock or at the end of the school year.

Wallets or small handbags must be no larger than 4X6 inches. There is a basket at the front desk to check the size if needed. BINDERS THAT ZIP ARE NOT PERMITTED UNLESS THEY ARE INSPECTED UPON ARRIVAL EACH MORNING AND TAGGED WITH THE DATE.



Dress code parameters:

- •No obscene or vulgar words or images (this includes no drug, marijuana and/or alcohol images, advertisements or words)
- •No hats, bandanas, or head coverings (with the exception of religious items)
- •Shorts/skirts 5" from top of knee
- No bare midriffs
- •Strapless, backless, spaghetti straps, tank or halter tops are not allowed unless covered by a sweater, shirt or jacket.
- •No see through, low cut or revealing clothing is allowed.
- •No bedroom slippers or pajamas
- No Gang-related apparel
- •No overly-suggestive or violent clothing or clothing advertising alcohol, tobacco and/or marijuana.

Drop off and pick up reminder:

We strongly recommend students not arriving until 7:30 a.m. or later be dropped off in the back lot between the athletic entrance and the tennis courts. Students arriving between 7:10 and 7:30 a.m. for breakfast must enter through the FRONT doors but students cannot be dropped off in the street. The police have been and will continue to issue tickets for anyone impeding traffic by stopping their vehicle in the street to drop off or pick up a student.

If you are waiting to pick up a student at the end of the day we STRONGLY recommend that all pick ups are done in the back lot where there is plenty of room. IF you are picking up from the front, you MUST PARK in a parking spot to wait.

Students who are not staying for a school sponsored event such as homework help, after school clubs or members of any athletic team MUST leave school grounds right after school. Please make arrangements for your student to be picked up in a timely manner. SCHOOL IS DISMISSED AT 2:40 P.M. and we have far too many students waiting for lengthy amounts of time to get picked up.

NO FOOD DELIVERIES AT SCHOOL

Food delivery services such as Uber Eats, DoorDash, or GrubHub may **NOT** drop off food to the school for students. If a parent/guardian or other family member drops off food it will be kept at the security desk until LUNCH. NO food/drink will be delivered to students in classrooms as this is a disruption to the learning environment. If students are expecting food to be dropped off by a family member, it is the student's responsibility to check the front desk on their way to lunch. We provide a FREE lunch each day and if students choose not to eat the options offered here at school, that is their choice, however, we are not going to allow disruptions to interfere with learning.

COLLEGE & CAREER ADVISING UPDATES

Michigan Reconnect Expansion, Adults Ages 21 and Over Eligible for Tuition-Free Community College

Adults ages 21-24 who have not yet earned a college degree. Program availability for the younger age group is limited; applicants must enroll no later than Nov. 15, 2024.

Students not already enrolled must complete these steps to take advantage of this limited-time scholarship:

- 1. Apply for the Michigan Reconnect Scholarship at michigan.gov/Reconnect by Nov. 15, 2024.
- 2. Apply to a Michigan community or tribal college.
- 3. File a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- 4. Enroll in your program of study and begin coursework no later than the fall semester 2024.

Already enrolled students should contact their college's Financial Aid Office for additional information on applying the Reconnect Scholarship to their tuition bill and filing a FAFSA.

SENIOR PICTURES (*Must be selected by 12/13/23*): We require students to use **Prestige Photography** located in Ferndale if they do not want to use their school id photo in the yearbook. You can contact them at 248-871-9898 to schedule an in-studio session.

Prestige photographers will also be here at HPHS on Friday, December 1st to take senior photos and yearbook headshots. The fee for this service is \$20 (payable by cash or check only). They know all the requirements for the yearbook image for your senior and will deliver your image to the yearbook for you. Once your photo is taken and selected by 12/13/23, you won't have to worry about anything!

To be clear, only special senior photos taken with Prestige will be published. Again, for your convenience, their photographers will be at our school on Friday, December 1st to take headshots. Once your photo is selected for the yearbook by, Prestige will ensure it gets delivered to the yearbook staff.

PHOTO REQUIREMENTS (see examples below): Senior year is a special one, and your senior headshot should reflect the best version of you! Please see sample images below for an appropriate look for your special senior photo. Whether you choose to take your photo in-studio or here on Friday, December 1st, make sure you are dressed to impress! Our school dress code policy applies to photos, too. After your picture is taken, make sure you select it through Prestige by the deadline of 12/13/23. Photos NOT selected through Prestige by this deadline will not be included in the 2024 Yearbook.







SENIOR BABY PICTURES: *(Must be turned in by 1/26/24)*: You may submit your baby picture for yearbook publication. Send an electronic version to hphs.yearbook@myhpsd.org. We CANNOT scan any printed photos this year.
