


#### DROP OFF AND ENTRANCE PROCEDURE:

From 7:10 a.m. - 8:30 a.m. <u>ALL STUDENTS MUST BE DROPPED OFF AT THE ATHLETIC DOORS (DOOR\*19) LOCATED IN THE BACK OF THE BUILDING</u>. For the safety of everyone, please adhere to the one way entering and exiting into the back parking lot..

Our security staff will be there, greeting the students. Students will go through a metal detector when they arrive, and then be directed to the cafeteria, where breakfast will be available. Students will remain in the cafeteria until 7:30 a.m. when students will be released from the cafeteria and allowed to go to their lockers and classrooms in preparation to begin school promptly at 7:40 a.m.

**After 8:30 a.m.**, students being dropped off, parents picking up, or any visitor coming to our building will be able to use the front parking lot and enter through door #1. Everyone will still be required to go through a metal detector there before continuing into the school.

At the end of the day, students will still be allowed to exit any door. There is NO PICKING UP in the front parking at the end of the day. This lot will continue to be for staff and visitors parking only. We STRONGLY encourage picking up in the back lot where there is plenty of room and no chance of getting an impeding traffic ticket on the street.



TO SPEED UP THE ENTRANCE PROCESS, PLEASE CLEAN OUT YOUR BAGS AND ONLY BRING WHAT IS ABSOLUTELY NEEDED FOR SCHOOL.

Backpacks, purses, winter coats, hats and/or blankets may **NOT** be brought in classrooms. They must be placed in lockers. All students will be issued a school combination lock if they do not bring their own lock. A \$10 fine was issued but will be removed when the lock is replaced with a personal lock or at the end of the school year.

Wallets or small handbags must be no larger than 4X6 inches. BINDERS THAT ZIP ARE NOT PERMITTED UNLESS THEY ARE INSPECTED UPON ARRIVAL EACH MORNING AND TAGGED WITH THE DATE.



#### Dress code parameters:

- •No obscene or vulgar words or images (this includes no drug, marijuana and/or alcohol images, advertisements or words)
- No hats, bandanas, or head coverings (with the exception of religious items)
- •Shorts/skirts 5" from top of knee
- No bare midriffs
- •Strapless, backless, spaghetti straps, tank or halter tops are not allowed unless covered by a sweater, shirt or jacket.
- •No see through, low cut or revealing clothing is allowed.
- No bedroom slippers or pajamas
- ●No Gang-related apparel
- •No overly-suggestive or violent clothing or clothing advertising alcohol, tobacco and/or marijuana.

Students who are not staying for a school sponsored event such as homework help, after school clubs or members of any athletic team MUST leave school grounds right after school. Please make arrangements for your student to be picked up in a timely manner. SCHOOL IS DISMISSED AT 2:40 P.M. and we have far too many students waiting for lengthy amounts of time to get picked up.

There was communication from the district about issues with students "loitering" at the local res. In Michigan, **loitering** is defined as standing or waiting around without a clear purpose in a public place. It can also include remaining in one place for an extended period of time. Loitering can be a crime in Michigan and can lead to a disorderly conduct charge, which is a misdemeanor. Penalties for a misdemeanor include: Up to \$500 fine, Up to 90 days in jail, Probation, and Community service. Please speak with your student about not loitering at Taco Bell or any public place. They may purchase food, eat and then are expected to leave the premises.

#### NO FOOD DELIVERIES AT SCHOOL

Food delivery services such as Uber Eats, DoorDash, or GrubHub may NOT drop off food to the school for students. If a parent/guardian or other family member drops off food it will be kept in the front office until LUNCH. The person dropping off the food MUST show ID and match the name on PowerSchool as the parent/guardian in order for the student to pick up the food at lunch. NO food/drink will be delivered to students in classrooms as this is a disruption to the learning environment nor will students be allowed to leave class to retrieve dropped off food items.. If students are expecting food to be dropped off by a family member, it is the student's responsibility to



check the front desk on their way to lunch. We provide a FREE lunch each day and if students choose not to eat the options offered here at school, that is their choice, however, we are not going to allow disruptions to interfere with learning.

- **GRADUATION CEREMONY** 7pm on the high school football field. Graduates have unlimited seating for an outdoor ceremony. However, if there is inclement weather, the ceremony will be held inside in the auditorium and a ticket is REQUIRED. 5 tickets per graduate will be given to students with their caps and gowns this week or can be picked up in the main office.

additional person with each handicap reserved seat. This seating will be on the track rather than in the bleachers.

This is our 132nd HPHS Commencement Ceremonies and we are adhering to tradition, therefore, CAPS MAY **NOT** BE DECORATED AND **NO PERSONALIZED SASHES OR ITEMS** MAY BE WORN.

- Tossing the cap at the end of the ceremony is tradition, therefore, we highly recommend writing first and last names in the caps and securing the tassel.
- Diplomas will be distributed after the ceremony by the athletic entrance labeled door #15. All fines must be paid and all items such as locks, loaned cap/gown, textbooks, computers, etc. before the diploma will be issued. If a graduate is unable to pick up their diploma after the ceremony due to fines or unreturned items they may pay the fine or return the items to the main office anytime M-F 8 a.m.- 4 p.m until June 20th or M-Th 8 am.-4 p.m. beginning June 23rd and would receive their diploma at that time.
- This is a formal event, therefore appropriate dress attire is EXPECTED to be worn under the gown. Shorts, sweats, leggings, crocks and tennis shoes are NOT appropriate and are not permitted. Flat shoes or wedges are required. NO pointed heels as they will stick in the field making it difficult to walk and will cause damage to the field. Any graduate needing assistance with dress clothes should contact our main office or their counselor. Caps must be worn flat on the head. We recommend using pins to secure them during the ceremony.
- Graduates will <u>not be allowed to have cell phones in their</u>
   <u>possession</u> during the ceremony. Graduates are encouraged to
  leave them with a trusted adult in the audience, in their car or not
  bring them at all.




