### **Back to School Registration Information:**

Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Hazel Park School District will once again be utilizing the online <u>Back to School</u> <u>Registration</u> process for the 2022-2023 school year. This simple online process must be completed by all parents/guardians of all students attending Hazel Park Schools. The Back to School Registration allows the Hazel Park District to schedule your child or children into a classroom, as well as allows you to update any information that may have changed since the previous school year.

Included is an instructional sheet, which outlines how changes can be made to your student's information. Also included is your MISTAR ParentPortal pin and password, which will provide you access to the MISTAR ParentPortal. Please note that this password can be changed once you have logged in if you wish to.

If you do not have access to a computer or the Internet, computers are available for your use in the Enrollment Office by appointment only at the Hazel Park Schools Administration Building, located at 1620 E. Elza. Please note the Back to School Registration process can be completed from a cell phone by accessing the QParent Connect App.

If you need assistance with Back to School Registration, please contact the Enrollment Office at (248) 658-5205 or feel free to email us enrollhps@hazelparkschools.org.

The enrollment office is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 3:30 pm. Summer hours which are July through August the enrollment office is open Monday through Thursday from 8:00 am to 3:30 pm. In observance of the Fourth of July holiday the office will be closed July 4th.

This process MUST be completed by July 1, 2022 in order for your student(s) to be scheduled into their classroom and begin the 2022-2023 school year. The school calendar will be made available as soon as teacher negotiations are completed. We look forward to educating your student(s) in the upcoming year and hope that everyone has a great 2022-2023 school year.

As of December 3, 2021, backpacks, purses, winter coats, hats and/or blankets may NOT be brought in classrooms. They must be placed in lockers. All students have been issued a school combination lock if they did not bring their own lock. A \$10 fine was issued but will be removed when the lock is replaced with a personal lock or at the end of the school year. Wallets or small handbags must be no larger than 4X6 inches. There is a basket at the front desk to check the size if needed.



#### Dress code parameters:

•No obscene or vulgar words or images (this includes no drug and/or alcohol images and/or words)

•No hats, bandanas, or head coverings (with the exception of religious items)•Shorts/skirts 5" from top of knee

•No bare midriffs

•Strapless, backless, spaghetti straps, tank or halter tops are not allowed unless covered by a sweater, shirt or jacket.

- •No see through, low cut or revealing clothing is allowed.
- •No bedroom slippers or pajamas
- •No Gang-related apparel

•No overly-suggestive or violent clothing or clothing advertising alcohol, tobacco and/or marijuana.

#### Drop off and pick up reminder:

We strongly recommend students not arriving until 7:30 a.m. or later be dropped off in the back lot between the athletic entrance and the tennis courts. Students arriving between 7:10 and 7:30 a.m. for breakfast must enter through the front doors but students cannot be dropped off in the street. The police have been and will continue to issue tickets for anyone impeding traffic by stopping their vehicle in the street to drop off or pick up a student.

If you are waiting to pick up a student at the end of the day we STRONGLY recommend that all pick ups are done in the back lot where there is plenty of room. IF you are picking up from the front, you MUST PARK in a parking spot to wait.

Students who are not staying for a school sponsored event such as homework help, after school clubs or members of any athletic team MUST leave school grounds right after school. Please make arrangements for your student to be picked up in a timely manner. SCHOOL IS DISMISSED AT 2:40 P.M. and we have far too many students waiting for lengthy amounts of time to get picked up.

#### NO FOOD DELIVERIES AT SCHOOL

Food delivery services such as Uber Eats, Door Dash, or Grub Hub may **NOT** drop off food to the school for students. If a parent/guardian or other family member drops off food it will be kept at the security desk until LUNCH. NO food/drink will be delivered to students in classrooms as this is a disruption to the learning environment. If students are expecting food to be dropped off by a family member, it is the student's responsibility to check the front desk on their way to lunch. We provide a FREE lunch each day and if students choose not to eat the options offered here at school, that is their choice, however, we are not going to allow disruptions to interfere with learning.
