



Project SEARCH is a one-year secondary transition educational program for students with developmental disabilities with the goal of competitive and integrated employment.



- Receive classroom instruction on employability and independent living skills

- · Engage in job seeking activities
- Gain skills needed to obtain a community job that aligns with their post secondary goals

PROGRAM ENTRANCE REQUIRMENTS:

The application process takes place each winter. Student applicants must meet the following requirements for consideration:

- · Desire to learn to work independently in the workplace
- Desire and plan to work in the community for a minimum of 20 hours per week upon completion of the program
- · Be between 18-26 years of age
- Submit an application to Troy School District for eligibility determination
- . Be willing to participate in unpaid training
- Able to participate in a full-day schedule starting at 8:00am
- · Comfortable in a busy setting
- Eligible for Michigan Rehabilitation Services
- Have independent personal care, including hygiene, restroom, eating, dressing, and grooming skills
- Follow all business and workplace expectations
- Maintain safe and appropriate behavior and social skills
- Be able to communicate effectively
- Take direction from authority figures and modify behavior accordingly
- Manage transportation options including public transportation

A transition plan identifies opportunities for the student to gain knowledge and skills needed for continuing education, work, and community participation, in preparation for adult life.

Every 10 seconds in the U.S., food allergies send a patient to the emergency room.



Nearly any food can trigger an allergic reaction. The "top 9" most common allergens includes several foods that regularly appear as ingredients in candy.



Some kids and their families don't feel comfortable trick-or-treating, because the risk of being exposed to an allergen is just too high.



The food goes very quickly, so please come early to get in line.

Hazel Park Schools has partnered with Gleaners Community Food Bank to bring the School Mobile Food Pantry to our students and their families. *Food distributions per family total 36 lbs of food which includes milk, lean meats, fresh fruits, vegetables, and dry goods every month.*

Please line up in your car in the parking lot, going down Elza in front of the school. <u>Please do not block any</u> <u>driveways and be sure to line up along the curb to avoid blocking the road.</u> We appreciate your cooperation in this matter out of respect and safety for our neighbors.

Here are a few **NEW RULES** and procedures provided by Gleaners: 1. Food pickup line will **NOT** begin until 9:30 am; 2. Walk ups **CANNOT** receive food until 10 am (30 minutes after the line has begun); 3. Food will **ONLY** be distributed for 1 hour, our distribution will end at 10:30 am; 4. You must be present with your card, no pickups or delivery allowed; 5. No more than 6 servings per car; 6. Staff must come through the line in their vehicle or wait until all the cars have been processed; 7. We are now required to ask for your income and/or program you are enrolled in (ex. SNAP Benefits); 8. We **CANNOT** hold food for families, it must be obtained during the Gleaners distribution; 9. We will **NEVER** ask for a driver's license; 10. Any remaining food will be sent back to Gleaners.

Please have your Gleaners card ready when you arrive. If you are new to Gleaners and do not have a card, you will be asked to fill out a form with your information as well as information for those in your household.

Gleaner's information will be sent by email and voice messages as reminders when you sign up for communications through your children's school.

Sign up for communications may be done through your Parent Portal on PowerSchool or the school district website, www.hazelparkschools.org/parents/resources-quick-links, then click on Alert Sign up.

Contact your Community Representative to help your family with resources for things such as bill pay, eyeglasses, local food pantries, and other resources. We want to make sure that all the needs of our students are addressed to the best of our abilities.
