We have scheduled some 2024 Bond Proposal Informational School Bus Tours for our district. Come and take the bus tour with us or follow along in your car to get a guided tour on what is included in the 2024 Bond Proposal that Hazel Park and Ferndale residents will vote on May 7, 2024.

We also have three Community Meetings scheduled to answer any questions you may have regarding the bond. They are Feb. 28 (Zoom - 10 to 11:30 am & In-Peson - 7 to 8:30 pm), March 7 (In-Person - 10 to 11:30 am & Zoom - 7 to 8:30 pm), and April 10 (Zoom - 11 am to 12:30 pm & In-Person - 6:30 to 8 pm). Change of Early Dismissal Procedure

Per board policy, we can no longer release students to people on their emergency list without some sort of communication from parents. We either need a call (from the number of a parent listed on MiStar), written note or email (from the email of a parent listed on MiStar) to release a student from school early giving the person permission to take their child out of school. This can ONLY be done for people that are listed as emergency contacts in MiStar. We CANNOT release students early to a person not listed as a contact in MiStar even with a note.
