## **Technology**

Please note that the same rules apply for smart watches as they do for cell phones. Students cannot have any electronic devices from home on them or with them during the school day. We are responsible for monitoring our students on technology and we are not able to do that for devices beyond what the school provides. If your child has to carry a device they must leave it in their backpacks/lockers or give them to their teachers before school. Please make sure you and your child(ren) are following this important rule. If students are using/wearing devices during the school day, they will be confiscated and sent to the office for a parent to pick up at the end of the school day.

## Change of Early Dismissal Procedure

Per board policy, we can no longer release students to people on their emergency list without some sort of communication from parents. We either need a call (from the number of a parent listed on MiStar), written note or email (from the email of a parent listed on MiStar) to release a student from school early giving the person permission to take their child out of school. This can ONLY be done for people that are listed as emergency contacts in MiStar. We CANNOT release students early to a person not listed as a contact in MiStar even with a note.
