A four-week summer experience will be offered to students who attended Webster Early Childhood Center during the 2024-2025 school year or newly enrolled at Hazel Park Schools and will be entering Kindergarten in the Fall of 2025. The Kindergarten Readiness summer experience is designed to build strong literacy and numeracy skills while engaging in immersive STEM and play-based learning. A focus on Kindergarten readiness skills will be a key component of the Early Childhood Summer Program.





SCAN THE QR CODE TO REGISTER Michigan Summer EBT is a program through which eligible families will receive \$120 for each child to buy groceries during the summer. Some families will receive Summer EBT benefits automatically, but other families will need to apply, especially those households with eligible children who attend a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school.

Those households will apply through an <u>MI Bridges</u> application. Children who receive Michigan Summer EBT can still participate in other summer meal programs.
