Dear Webb Families,



End of Year Awards

YMCA SportPort

Playground After School

As the weather gets nicer, more families choose to stay and play on the playground after school. Please don't forget our school rule about playground use after school. Any students staying on the playground after school MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT and the adult must be physically in the playground area. This does NOT count for older siblings. Students who walk home, must go home and cannot return until after 6PM (when latchkey is done for the day) without an adult. We do NOT monitor the playground after school. Adults MUST monitor their students. We appreciate your help with this.

<u>Summer Spectacular</u>

Next week on Tuesday we will again have our annual Summer Spectacular. This is a full day of fun fully funded and put on by our wonderful PTA. Please keep in mind a couple of important tips for a successful day.

- The students will participate in many water activities (in the past we have gone to the splash park for one of our stations and had the fire department come by and spray the kids with the fire hose, plus other fun water stations), so we highly recommend packing or wearing a swimsuit and then an extra set of clothes to change into (including underwear) for when they go home. It's a long day to be wet.
- SOCKS MUST BE BROUGHT OR WORN (If you plan to have them wear socks and shoes all day, you might want to send in an extra pair). We bring in several bounce houses and the kids must have on socks to be able to participate in those activities.

We highly suggest that you put some sort of sunscreen on your student. If you plan to send extra sunscreen in with your child, please make sure it is labeled with your child's name. Also we MUST HAVE A SIGNED NOTE FROM PARENTS FOR STUDENTS TO PUT ON SUNSCREEN AT SCHOOL. We cannot apply sunscreen that has not been sent in from home and does not come with a note. Students cannot share sunscreen with each other. This comes directly from our district nurses.

Report Cards

Report Cards will be sent home with students on Friday.

Re-enrollment

The district has put enrollment and re-enrollment back in the hands of the schools. We struggle every year to get many of our parents to re-enroll from school which leaves us with information that is not updated or accurate for the students. STUDENTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO RETURN TO SCHOOL NEXT YEAR IF THEY ARE NOT RE-ENROLLED in PowerSchool. If you have any questions, or need help, please reach out to the school office. Here are some helpful directions:

- Login to the PowerSchool Parent Portal @ https://hazelpark.powerschool.com/public/home.html
- Use your username and password. If you don't know it, please reach out to the school office to obtain that information.
- Once you have logged in, click on the "more" button (bottom right)
- Click on "forms"
- Make sure you click on "enrollment forms
- You will need to fill out each section of the forms. THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT.
 If all forms are not completed your child will not be enrolled or on class lists for
 next year.
- After you fill out the form, it will say "pending review". That just means the administration building has to approve it.
- Please be sure that ALL CONTACT INFORMATION IS UPDATED FOR ALL EMERGENCY CONTACTS.
- I highly encourage families to put any emergency contacts that may have to pick up your student from school - WE CANNOT RELEASE STUDENTS TO PEOPLE WHO ARE NOT ON THE EMERGENCY LIST.

Feel free to reach out to the office if you have any questions or issues with this process. In order to support you, we will have a computer on hand in the office if you need to come into the office to complete this process.

A four-week summer experience will be offered to students who attended Webster Early Childhood Center during the 2024-2025 school year or newly enrolled at Hazel Park Schools and will be entering Kindergarten in the Fall of 2025.

The Kindergarten Readiness summer experience is designed to build strong literacy and numeracy skills while engaging in immersive STEM and play-based learning. A focus on Kindergarten readiness skills will be a key component of the Early Childhood Summer Program.





SCAN THE QR CODE TO REGISTER Michigan Summer EBT is a program through which eligible families will receive \$120 for each child to buy groceries during the summer. Some families will receive Summer EBT benefits automatically, but other families will need to apply, especially those households with eligible children who attend a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school.

Those households will apply through an <u>MI Bridges</u> application. Children who receive Michigan Summer EBT can still participate in other summer meal programs.




Tuesday, June 17 1:00 pm

This project is funded in part by Michigar Humanities, an affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities, and the Michigan Arts and Culture Council.








