Thank you to all of our families who make school attendance a priority. It is so critical that, even in elementary school, the students are attending school on time each and every day unless they are sick. Missed time results in students getting behind in their learning. Over time that can have a great impact on the learning trajectory for a student and can put them behind in all areas. Research shows that students who are behind in elementary school are at a far greater risk for school dropout. Please take a look at the chart to the side to see how absences can add up over time. Even coming late each day can impact your child's education. We hope you will make every effort to make school a priority and have your child to school on time each day.

#### YOU MATTER!

#### Attendance matters when it comes to school success.

1 or 2 days a week doesn't seem like much but....

If your child misses	That equals	Which is	And over 13 years of schooling that's

#### **Positive Attendance Matters for Student Success!**

#### Students with positive attendance:



Have higher academic achievement



Are more likely to read proficiently by Grade 3



Are more likely to graduate and less likely to drop out of school



Have increased social-emotional capabilities and abilities to build relationships

Are more likely to attend, persist in, and graduate from college

#### Strategies for families to improve attendance

#### **Elementary School**

- Create consistent bedtime and morning routines.
- Have your child pack their backpack and choose their clothes the night before.
- Establish backup plans for going to school if something comes up. Connect with a family member, neighbor, or other parent to bring your child to school.
- Maintain healthy habits, and when your child has to stay home sick, contact their teacher for the day's learning materials.
- Schedule appointments and trips during non-school hours or during school breaks.

#### Middle and High School

- Establish daily attendance as a priority and talk with your child about the importance of attending school every day, being on time, and not cutting class.
- Help your child maintain consistent daily routines, such as finishing their homework, getting a good night's sleep, and setting a wake-up alarm.
- Help your child stay engaged in school.
- Watch for signs of low student engagement in school, anxiety, bullying, and the need for additional academic support.
- Schedule appointments and trips during non-school hours or during school breaks.

#### Holiday Baskets

We will again be collecting donations for Holiday Baskets at Webb. There is a district-wide effort to collect food for those in need. The winning classroom will receive a pizza party so be sure your child takes the items to the classroom to be counted first. If you are or know someone in need, applications to receive a holiday basket will be available in the school office starting November 3rd. At this time, holiday baskets are only given to those families that live within the school district, but out of district families can inquire about help as there are other resources in the community that we can connect you with.

The PTA will be sponsoring a Jingle Jog event for our students as a way to raise funds to support the work the PTA does for our students. More information will be coming about how your child can earn money for the school by getting donations to support their goals. #### Report Cards

Report Cards went home with students on Wednesday. Please keep in mind that there is a new format for report cards. They are based on grade level standards. When you see standards that do not have a number, that means that standard was not taught or assessed this quarter but will be taught later on during the year. The students are given numbers to show their current progress:

- 4=Student working above grade level expectations
- 3=Student meeting grade level expectations
- 2=Student approaching but not meeting grade level expectations
- 1=Not meeting grade level expectations

We also sent home reports regarding your child's reading level and how you can help them at home (IRLA Report) as well as information about their reading and math achievement according the I-Ready assessments we give 3 times per year. Students in grades K-3 received IRIP reports that discuss reading progress and needs and students in grades 4-5 received M-STEP results from last spring. Please let your child's teacher know if you have any questions or concerns.

#### **Bagels**

We sell bagels on WEDNESDAYS this year. We offer salt, plain, cinnamon raisin & onion. Students who are late will NOT be allowed to buy a bagel unless they have a doctor's note for their tardiness. The cost of the bagels is \$1.25. Please keep in mind that all proceeds from these sales support our positive behavior celebrations throughout the year.

#### Holiday Needs


With the holidays and cold weather approaching we wanted to remind you of a couple of things. If your child(ren) is/are in need of boots or coats, please let us know in the office. #### Food Boxes

Due to the ongoing federal government shutdown that has suspended the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, Hazel Park Schools has been able to partner with <u>Forgotten Harvest</u> to provide food boxes to our families. On Wednesday, Nov. 12, 2025, from 2 to 4 pm at the Ford Administration Building (1620 E. Elza), over 800 food boxes will be distributed to our Hazel Park School families. Due to the rules in the grant we obtained, food can **ONLY** be given to families with students enrolled at Hazel Park Schools. Parents will have to fill out some data just as we do for Gleaners.


